- Aluminum cans
- Broth boxes
- Cardboard-flattened
- Cereal boxes
- Condiment jars
- Cottage cheese containers
- Cracker boxes
- Dish soap bottles
- Foil trays (clean)
- Glass bottles/jars
- Junk mail
- Laundry detergent
- Fabric Softener
- Magazines/flyers
- Milk jugs / cartons
- Newspapers with inserts

- Office/school scrap papers
- Paper bags
- Phonebooks
- Pop/beer boxes
- Produce containers
- Shampoo bottles
- Soft covered books
- Soda bottles
